**James Graham, Samar Barron and Isaiah Parker Plead Guilty for Crimes  
Related to the Death of Ali Huntley, Jr.**

Rochester, NY- On Monday, June 19, 18-year-old James Graham and 19-year-old Samar Barron both pled guilty to Manslaughter in the 1<sup>st</sup> Degree for causing the death of 24-year-old Ali Huntley, Jr. 20-year-old Isaiah Parker also pled guilty to Tampering with Physical Evidence in relation to the same crime. On July 12, 2016, the community was holding a vigil on North Clinton Avenue in remembrance for an individual who had recently been killed. During the vigil, Barron drove a vehicle by while his passenger, Graham, open-fired, shooting and killing Ali Huntley, Jr. After the homicide, Parker attempted to hide the vehicle by having it towed to another location. Graham and Barron will each serve 17 years in the New York State Department of Corrections with 5 years of post-release supervision. Parker is to serve 1 year in the Monroe County Jail for his role.

The case was prosecuted by Senior Assistant District Attorneys Greg Colavecchia and Michael Bezer of the Major Felony Bureau.

"Today's admission is the result of the help received from the community," said Assistant District Attorney Greg Colavecchia. "Together, James Graham and Samar Barron senselessly took the life of Mr. Huntley. An innocent life was lost due to the selfish actions of these two defendants and thanks to the hard work and dedication of the Rochester Police Department, Parker's attempt to hinder the investigation was unsuccessful. Our hope is that this will help to bring closure to the victim's friends and family as well as deter this type of unthinkable criminal behavior in the future."

James Graham and Samar Barron will be sentenced on July 20, 2017, and Isaiah Parker will be sentenced on August 24, 2017, all in front of County Court Judge Argento.
