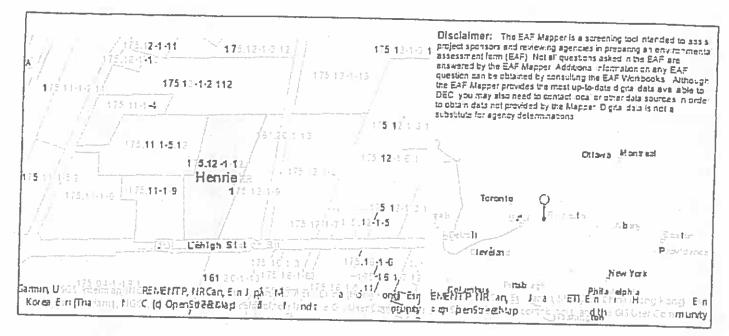

According to the New York State Cultural Resource Inventory System (CRIS) this action is not an action subject to review as no construction or disturbance is involved in this properly transfer. Future actions that involve disturbance may be subject to environmental review, including cultural review at that time.

According to the New York State DECinfo Locator the closest adjoining property that has been the site of remediation is approximately 1600 feet south of the parcel and is not directly adjacent to the parcel that is the subject of this review. This parcel transfer does not include disturbance to the parcel Accordingly, the tack of physical disturbance and proximity indicate that no environmental impacts to the remediation site will occur from the transfer of this parcel.

Lastly, the site is home to a large wetland that is adjacent to Red Creek, and appears to be part of a larger wetland that might be subject to the Freshwater Wetlands Act. Although the wetland could be impacted by the future use of the property, it will not be impacted due to the sale of this parcel. Future use or development of the parcel may be subject to a wetland delineation and the New York State Freshwater Wetlands Act.

The sale of this property does not include physical disturbance or development of the parcel and will not result in any significant adverse environmental impacts
