Monroe County Is providing APRA Funds to Multicraft Apprenticeship Preparation Program, Inc. ("MAPP") to expand its existing training program. This includes programmatic and service delivery, as well as expanding their operation into an enlarged facility. It is anticipated that the MAPP training center expansion will renovate an existing space for both academic tutoring and hards-on training in general and skilled trades. Expansion is expected at its current space or a new space within a an existing commercial, light industrial, industrial setting. Such a site will be previously disturbed and/or built out and only require renovations. As this expansion is anticipated to be primarily interior renovations and/or located in a suitable light industrial to industrial site it will not impact the character, aesthetics, or historic resources of the area; it will not impact or increase the potential for erosion, flooding, drainage problems; nor will it create a hazard to human health or environmental health.
