Installing underground electrical conduit and sub-panels will allow direct electrical hook up by vendors, thus eliminating the need for on-site diesel generators. Concurrent with the electrical conduit, liber optic conduit will be installed thus allowing wireless internet throughout Park. The current communication and internet services throughout the Park are coax, a technology that is well past its time.


Minor earthan disturbances would occur when digging for the bury and return pits necessary to advance the directional drilling of the conduit. 

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body determine whether underground power and data utility upgrades at Gary Beikirch Memorial Park may have a significant adverse impact on the environment pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA").

This project, a component of the proposed \$9.4 million in Phase II Monroe County Parks system-wide improvements, will upgrade the electrical and data fiber connections throughout the festival site at Gary Beikirch Memorial Park – formerly known as Highland Park South – used for various park purposes including the annual Lilac Festival. This project will greatly decrease the noise and environmental impact created by the current heavy use of temporary generators during events and will provide better Internet service to park staff and vendors.

The underground utility work has been preliminarily classified as an Unlisted Action. The SEQRA regulations found at 6 NYCRR Part 617 require that no agency shall carry out or approve an Action until it has complied with the requirements of SEQRA.

The specific legislative actions required are:

- 1. Determine that the underground utility work is an Unlisted action.
- 2. Make a determination of significance regarding underground utility work pursuant to 6 NYCRR 617.7.

3. Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to take such actions to comply with the requirements of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, including without limitation, the execution of documents and the filing, distribution and publication of the documents required under the State Environmental Quality Review Act, and any other actions to implement the intent of this resolution.

This designation will have no impact on the revenues or expenditures of the current Monroe County budget.

I recommend that this matter be referred to the appropriate committee(s) for favorable action by Your Honorable Body.


