As this expansion is anticipated to be primarily interior renovations and/or located in a suitable light industrial to industrial site it will not impact the character, aesthetics, or historic resources of the area; it will not impact or increase the potential for erosion, flooding, drainage problems; nor will it create a hazard to human health or environmental health.
