Honorable Legislators:

This matter is being referred to Your Honorable Body at the request of Sheriff Todd K. Baxter.

I recommend that Your Honorable Body amend Resolution 102 of 2024 to accept additional funding from the United States Department of Homeland Security – Homeland Security Investigations – Rochester Division for State and Local Overtime in the amount of \$30,000 for the reimbursement of overtime for the period of February 1, 2024 through September 30, 2024.

This grant will reimburse a portion of the overtime costs associated with the overtime of one (1) Investigator, one (1) Sergeant, and five (5) Deputies assigned to HSI Rochester Investigations. This will be the fourth year the County has received this grant. This additional funding will bring the grant total to \$55,000.

The specific legislative actions required are:

1. Amend Resolution 102 of 2024 to accept an additional \$30,000 from, and to authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute a contract and any amendments thereto, with the United States Department of Homeland Security – Homeland Security Investigations – Rochester Division for State and Local Overtime for the reimbursement of overtime for the period of February 1, 2024 through September 30, 2024.

2. Amend the 2024 operating budget of the Office of the Sheriff by appropriating the sum of \$30,000 into general fund 9300, funds center 3803010000, Police Bureau Administration.

This matter is being referred to Your Honorable Body at the request of Sheriff Todd K. Baxter.

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept a grant from the New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services in the amount of \$60,000 for the FY2021 Explosive Detection Canine Team Grant Program (Development) for the period of April 1, 2024 through August 31, 2025.

This Federal Fiscal Year 2021 grant provides funds for the law enforcement community to support their terrorism prevention and preparedness efforts. The funds will be used to acquire a new K-9 vehicle and train a new K-9 for the Monroe County Sheriff's Office Explosive Detection Canine Team Program. This is the fourth time the County has received this grant. This year's funding represents an increase of \$10,000 from FY2018.

The specific legislative actions required are:

1. Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to accept a \$60,000 grant from, and to execute a contract and any amendments thereto, with the New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services for the FY2021 Explosive Detection Canine Team Grant Program (Development) for the period of April 1, 2024 through August 31, 2025.

Honorable Legislators:

This matter is being referred to Your Honorable Body at the request of Sheriff Todd K. Baxter.

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept two grants from the New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services in the amount of \$112,500 for the FY2021 and in the amount of \$100,000 for the FY2022 Bomb Squad Initiative Grant Program/Homeland Security's State Homeland Security Program for the period of April 1, 2024 through August 31, 2025.

These Federal Fiscal Year 2021 and 2022 grants provide funds for the law enforcement community to support their terrorism prevention and preparedness efforts. The funds will be used to purchase equipment and training to enhance the capabilities of the Monroe County Sheriff's Office FBI Certified Bomb Squad. This is the sixteenth time the County has received these grants. The 2021 funding represents the same level of funding from the 2020 grant.

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept a grant from the New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services in the amount of \$126,338 for the FY2021 Technical Rescue & Urban Search and Rescue Grant Program for the period of April 1, 2024 through August 31, 2025.

The New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services provides funding to support the continued development of the community's technical rescue capabilities. The intent of this grant is to promote regional partnerships using local agency support for technical rescue field response and operations. This program directly supports the on-going activities of the Monroe County Special Operations Unit and its regional partners

Specifically, this grant will enhance the ability to respond to technical rescue incidents in the areas of structural collapse, rope rescue, and related low-frequency/high risk events. This is the eleventh year the County has received the grant. This funding represents a decrease of \$4,600 from the previous grant.

The specific legislative actions required are:

- 1. Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to accept a \$126,338 grant from, and to execute a contract and any amendments thereto with, the New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services for the FY2021 Technical Rescue & Urban Search and Rescue Grant Program for the period of April 1, 2024 through August 31, 2025.

Subject: Amend Resolution 376 of 2023 to Accept Additional Funding from the New York State STOP-DWI Foundation, Inc. for DWI High Visibility Engagement Campaign Enforcement and Amend and Increase the Agreements with Ten Municipalities and Two State Entities

I recommend that Your Honorable Body amend Resolution 376 of 2023 to accept additional funding from the New York State STOP-DWI Foundation, Inc. in the amount of \$25,000 for DWI High Visibility Engagement Campaign Enforcement for the Department of Public Safety and the Office of the Sheriff and to amend and increase agreements with the City of Rochester, nine towns and villages in Monroe County with local police departments, the State University of New York at Brockport, and the New York State Police (Genesee Region) for the period of October 1, 2023 and through September 30, 2024.

The purpose of this grant is to reimburse local law enforcement agencies for overtime incurred during High Visibility Engagement Campaigns. The High Visibility Engagement Campaigns will be concerted efforts among the different police agencies to deploy extra patrols during specified holiday weekends in order to minimize the number of impaired driving crashes. This additional funding is in the amount of \$23,500 for the Department of Public Safety and in the amount of \$1,500 for the Sheriff's Office. This is the 13th year the County has received this grant.

The specific legislative actions required are:
