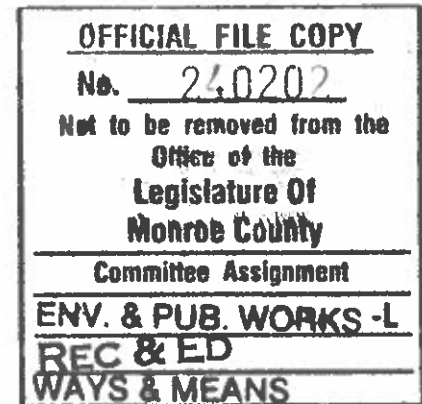

**Subject:** Amend the 2024-2029 Capital Improvement Program and 2024 Capital Budget to Add a Project Entitled “Monroe Community College Optics Micro-credential Laboratory;” Authorize Financing for the Project; and Authorize Contracts with the Dormitory Authority of the State of New York

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body amend the 2024-2029 Capital Improvement Program and 2024 Capital Budget to add a project entitled “Monroe Community College Optics Micro-credential Laboratory;” authorize financing for the project in the amount of \$2,700,000; and authorize contracts with the Dormitory Authority of the State of New York.

The Monroe Community College (“MCC”) Optics Project is currently underway to construct new academic spaces in conjunction with the new building for the Applied Technologies Center (“ATC”). Your Honorable Body approved that project by Resolution 402 of 2023. MCC has identified an opportunity to expand the Optics Program through the renovation of existing academic spaces to create Optics Micro-credential Laboratories. Micro-credentials are 12-credit “fast track” training programs validated by SUNY that can provide a participant with employer-essential skills in a 15-week timeframe. The dedicated laboratories will allow MCC to efficiently facilitate cohorts of 12 students and serve incumbent workers wanting to upskill, without having to negotiate lab and equipment time around those students seeking Associate degrees and certificates.

This project will relocate non-Optics labs and install new optics training equipment in renovated spaces in Building 9 at the Brighton Campus. The project will be adjacent to, and sequence with, the pending new construction of the ATC/Optics building. The renovations and availability of the space is anticipated for the Fall 2025 semester.

Partial reimbursement of 50% of project costs will be requested from New York State Empire State Development upon establishment of the Resolution and the capital fund.

The project is scheduled to be considered by the Monroe County Planning Board on June 27, 2024.

**The specific legislative actions required are:**

1. Amend the 2024-2029 Capital Improvement Program to add a project entitled “Monroe Community College Optics Micro-credential Laboratory” in the amount of \$2,700,000.

2. Amend the 2024 Capital Budget to add a project entitled “Monroe Community College Optics Micro-credential Laboratory” in the amount of \$2,700,000.
3. Authorize financing for the project entitled “Monroe Community College Optics Micro-credential Laboratory” in the amount of \$2,700,000.
4. Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute contracts with Empire State Development and/or the Dormitory Authority of the State of New York to purchase fixtures and equipment for the “Monroe Community College Optics Micro-credential Laboratory Project,” and any amendments necessary to complete the project within the total capital fund(s) appropriation.

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c)(2) (“replacement, rehabilitation or reconstruction of a structure or facility, in kind, on the same site, including upgrading buildings to meet building, energy, or fire codes, unless such action meets or exceeds any of the thresholds in section 617.4 of this Part”) and (10) (“routine activities of educational institutions, including expansion of existing facilities by less than 10,000 square feet of gross floor area and school closings, but not changes in use related to such closings”) and is not subject to further review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

Funding for this project, consistent with authorized uses, will be included in the capital fund to be created and any other capital fund(s) created for the same intended purpose. No additional net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

I recommend that this matter be referred to the appropriate committee(s) for favorable action by Your Honorable Body.

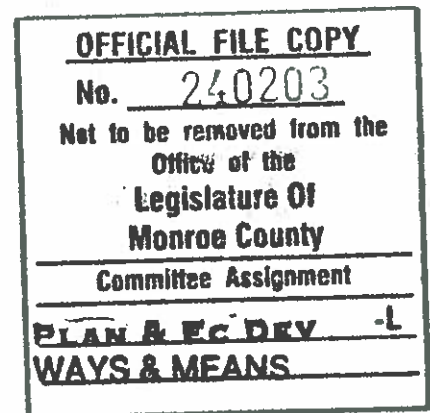

**Subject:** Acceptance of a Restore New York Grant from Empire State Development Corporation for the Triangle Building Project and Authorize a Grant Agreement with Jays Acquisitions II LLC, or a Subsidiary Thereof

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept a Restore New York grant from the Empire State Development Corporation in the amount of \$3,000,000 for the Triangle Building Project and enter into a grant agreement, and any accompanying grant documents, with Jays Acquisitions II LLC, or a subsidiary thereof to pass through grant funds up to the amount of \$3,000,000.

The purpose of this grant is to provide funding for a portion of the Triangle Building Project, which includes renovation of 39,000 sq. ft. of the Sibley Triangle Building into 36 residential apartments and 11,500 sq. ft. of lower floor commercial space on the .18 acre site located at 20-30 East Avenue in the City of Rochester. The remaining project costs of \$3,725,000 will be funded through equity and financing from the developer, Jays Acquisitions II LLC.

**The specific legislative actions required are:**

1. Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to accept a \$3,000,000 Restore New York grant from, and to execute a contract and any amendments thereto with, Empire State Development Corporation for the Triangle Building Project.
2. Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to enter into a grant agreement and any accompanying grant documents, and any amendments thereto, with Jays Acquisitions II LLC, or a subsidiary thereof, to utilize grant funds to reimburse for Triangle Building Project cost up to the amount of \$3,000,000.
3. Amend the 2024 operating budget of the Department of Planning and Development by appropriating the sum of \$3,000,000 into general fund 9300, funds center 1401010000, Planning Administration.

4. Authorize the County Executive to appropriate any subsequent years of the grant award in accordance with the grant terms, to reappropriate any unencumbered balances during the grant period according to the grantor requirements, to make any necessary funding modifications within the grant guidelines to meet contractual commitments, and to enter into any amendments to extend the time period of the grant.
5. Should funding of this program be modified or terminated for any reason, the County Executive is hereby authorized to terminate or modify the program and, where applicable, to terminate or abolish some or all positions funded under such program. Any termination or abolishment of positions shall be in accordance with New York State Civil Service Law and, when applicable, the terms of any labor agreement affecting such positions.

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c)(18) (“reuse of a residential or commercial structure, or of a structure containing mixed residential and commercial uses, where the residential or commercial use is a permitted use under the applicable zoning law or ordinance, including permitted by special-use permit, and the action does not meet or exceeds any of the thresholds in section 617.4 of this Part”) and is not subject to further review under the State Environmental Quality Review.

This grant is 100% funded by Empire State Development Corporation. No net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

I recommend that this matter be referred to the appropriate committee(s) for favorable action by Your Honorable Body.

The Town has submitted a Monroe County Municipal Sidewalk Funding Application to install approximately 4,435 linear feet of sidewalk along the north side of Tobey Road between Clover Street and Cricket Hill Drive (the "Project"). The total construction costs are anticipated to be approximately \$405,000. Through the intermunicipal agreement, the County will reimburse the Town in an amount not to exceed \$203,000 for construction expenses. The \$203,000 of the County's share will be paid for by the appropriation and transfer of committed fund balance pursuant to Resolution 197 of 2023.

The Project will connect existing sidewalk networks serving this area and provide a continuous path between residential neighborhoods, schools, the YMCA, Tobey Office Park, and the Village of Pittsford. The aforementioned project was identified as a high priority in the Town's and Village of Pittsford's 2019 Active Transportation Plan, and would further the goals of the County's Countywide Active Transportation Plan to fill gaps within the existing sidewalk network.

**The specific legislative actions required are:**

1. Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute an intermunicipal agreement, and any amendments thereto, with the Town of Pittsford in an amount not to exceed \$203,000 for the Tobey Road Sidewalk Project.
2. Amend the 2024 operating budget of the Department of Finance-Unallocated by appropriating committed fund balance in the amount of \$203,000 into general fund 9001, funds center 1209030000, Transfer to Other Funds.
3. Authorize an interfund transfer in the amount of \$203,000 from the Department of Finance-Unallocated, general fund 9001, funds center 1209030000, Transfer to Other Funds, to the Department of Transportation, road fund 9002, funds center 8002060000, Sidewalk Projects.

The Town of Pittsford will conduct a coordinated review and the provisions of SEQRA shall be complied with prior to Your Honorable Body undertaking, funding, or approving the action requested in this referral.

This interfund transfer will require \$203,000 of additional net County support for which the appropriation of committed fund balance is requested.

The total construction costs are anticipated to be approximately \$1,400,000. Through the intermunicipal agreement, the County will reimburse the Town in an amount not to exceed \$700,000 for construction expenses. The \$700,000 of the County's share will be paid for by the appropriation and transfer of committed fund balance pursuant to Resolution 197 of 2023.

The Project will connect existing sidewalk networks serving this area and provide a continuous path between residential neighborhoods, schools, town parks, several places of worship, and various retail and tourist destinations. Such connections were identified as a high priority in the Town's 2023 Comprehensive Plan Update, and would further the goals of the County's Countywide Active Transportation Plan to fill gaps within the existing sidewalk network.





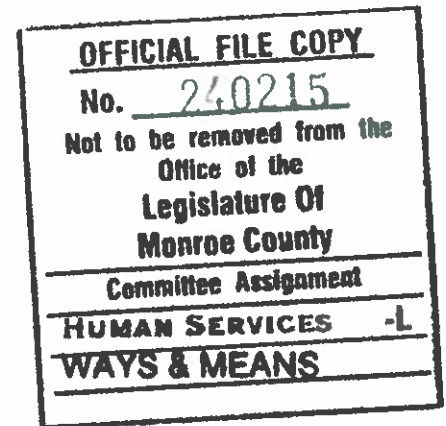

**Subject:** Amend Resolution 234 of 2023 to Amend and Increase the Contract with Ontario Bus Inc. for Bus Transportation Services for Monroe County Early Intervention and Preschool Special Education Programs

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body amend Resolution 234 of 2023 to amend and increase the contract with Ontario Bus Inc. for bus transportation services for children enrolled in the Monroe County Early Intervention and Preschool Special Education Programs for the period of July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2026, for the first year of the contract (July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024), with annual increases not to exceed the annual Consumer Price Index ("CPI") increase for the Northeast Urban area for the prior twelve months preceding the date on which the new contract year is to commence, and with the option to renew for two (2) additional one-year periods at an annual rate of increase not to exceed the annual CPI increase for the Northeast Urban area for the twelve months preceding each renewal.

This contract will provide New York State-mandated transportation services to children within Monroe County who are receiving services through our Early Intervention and Preschool Special Education Programs. Children within these programs receive a variety of services, including but not limited to speech therapy, occupational therapy, and physical therapy, which often require transportation to and from the child's home. Ontario Bus Inc. has a history of successfully providing such services to this specialized population.

**The specific legislative action required is to amend Resolution 234 of 2023 to amend and increase the contract with Ontario Bus Inc. for bus transportation services for the Monroe County Early Intervention and Preschool Special Education Programs from an amount not to exceed \$10,306,272 to an amount not to exceed \$15,800,000 for the first year of the contract (July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024).**

**Subject:** Amend Resolution 376 of 2023 to Accept Additional Funding from the New York State STOP-DWI Foundation, Inc. for DWI High Visibility Engagement Campaign Enforcement and Amend and Increase the Agreements with Ten Municipalities and Two State Entities

I recommend that Your Honorable Body amend Resolution 376 of 2023 to accept additional funding from the New York State STOP-DWI Foundation, Inc. in the amount of \$25,000 for DWI High Visibility Engagement Campaign Enforcement for the Department of Public Safety and the Office of the Sheriff and to amend and increase agreements with the City of Rochester, nine towns and villages in Monroe County with local police departments, the State University of New York at Brockport, and the New York State Police (Genesee Region) for the period of October 1, 2023 and through September 30, 2024.

The purpose of this grant is to reimburse local law enforcement agencies for overtime incurred during High Visibility Engagement Campaigns. The High Visibility Engagement Campaigns will be concerted efforts among the different police agencies to deploy extra patrols during specified holiday weekends in order to minimize the number of impaired driving crashes. This additional funding is in the amount of \$23,500 for the Department of Public Safety and in the amount of \$1,500 for the Sheriff's Office. This is the 13th year the County has received this grant.

**The specific legislative actions required are:**

1. Amend Resolution 376 of 2023 to accept an additional \$25,000 grant from, and to authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute a contract and any amendments thereto with, the New York State STOP-DWI Foundation, Inc. for DWI High Visibility Engagement Campaign Enforcement, bringing the total award to \$72,000 for the period of October 1, 2023 through September 30, 2024.
2. Amend the 2024 operating budget of the Department of Public Safety by appropriating the sum of \$23,500 into general fund 9300, funds center 2405040000, STOP-DWI Enforcement Agency Support.
3. Amend the 2024 operating budget of the Office of the Sheriff by appropriating the sum of \$1,500 into general fund 9300, funds center 3803010000, Police Bureau Administration.

6. Should funding of this program be modified or terminated for any reason, the County Executive is hereby authorized to terminate or modify the program and, where applicable, to terminate or abolish some or all positions funded under such program. Any termination or abolishment of positions shall be in accordance with New York State Civil Service Law and, when applicable, the terms of any labor agreement affecting such positions.

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c)(26) ("routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment") and is not subject to further review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

This grant is 100% funded by New York State STOP-DWI Foundation, Inc. No net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.
