Enact a Local Law Entitled "Increasing Income Limitation Regarding Real

Property Tax Exemption Granted To Persons Aged 65 or Over"

Honorable Legislators:

We recommend that Your Honorable Body enact a Local Law to increase the income limitation regarding the real property tax exemption granted to persons aged 65 or over.

New York State Real Property Tax Law ("RPTL") offers local governments the option to grant tax reductions and/or exemptions to individuals in need. By "opting into" a section of this law, a municipality can provide tax benefits to people who meet certain income limitations as well as other requirements.

Section 467 of the RPTL has been amended to allow a municipality to adopt a local law to increase the exemption schedule for persons sixty-five years and over. This proposed Local Law will amend the Code of Monroe County, Section 357-2(A)(1), as last amended by Local Law No. 2 of 2007, by increasing the income limitations regarding real property tax exemptions granted to persons aged 65 and over. The eligible income levels will be a 50% exemption for incomes up to \$50,000 and a graduated reduction in exemption for incomes more than \$50,000 but less than \$58,400.

The specific legislative action required is to adopt the proposed Local Law.

The Legislative Action required in this referral is not an "Action" as the term is defined in 6 NYCRR Section 617.5(b) and is not subject to review under State Environmental Quality Review Act.

This Local Law will have no impact on the revenues or expenditures of the current Monroe County budget.

We recommend that this matter receive favorable action by Your Honorable Body.

Honorable Legislators:

We recommend that Your Honorable Body enact a Local Law to increase the income limitation regarding the real property tax exemption granted to persons with disabilities and limited incomes.

New York State Real Property Tax Law ("RPTL") offers local governments the option to grant tax reductions and/or exemptions to individuals in need. By "opting into" a section of this law, a municipality can provide tax benefits to people who meet certain income limitations as well as other requirements.

Section 459-c of the RPTL has been amended to allow a municipality to adopt a local law to increase the exemption schedule for persons with disabilities and limited incomes. This proposed Local Law would further amend Monroe County Code, Section 357-43, as last amended by Local Law 3 of 2007 to increase the income limitations regarding real property tax exemptions granted to persons with disabilities and limited incomes. The eligible income levels will be a 50% exemption for incomes up to \$50,000 and a graduated reduction in exemption for incomes more than \$50,000 but less than \$58,400.

The specific legislative action required is to adopt the proposed Local Law.

Honorable Legislators:

We recommend that Your Honorable Body amend Resolution 265 of 1965 to provide an exemption from sales and compensating use taxes for receipts from retail sales of, and consideration given or contracted to be given for, certain clothing and footwear, pursuant to the authority of Article 29 of the Tax Law of the State of New York.

Clothing and footwear sold for less than \$110 per item or pair is exempt from the New York State 4% sales and use tax. A county may elect to provide the same exemption to take effect on March 1st of each year. Exempting eligible clothing and footwear from Monroe County's 4% sales and use tax will help our residents save money on essential items as well as help Monroe County retailers attract more customers, while having no measurable impact on projected annual sales tax revenues.

The specific legislative action required is to amend Subdivision (a) of section six of Resolution 265 of 1965, as amended, by adding a new paragraph 13 to read as follows: (13) Clothing and footwear described in paragraph (30) of subdivision (a) of section 1115 of the New York Tax Law.

The legislative action requested in this referral is not an "Action," as that term is defined in 6 NYCRR § 617.2(b), and is not subject to review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

This action will have no net impact on the revenues or expenditures of the current Monroe County budget.

We recommend that this matter be referred to the appropriate committee(s) for favorable action by Your Honorable Body.
