Honorable Legislators:

This matter is being referred to Your Honorable Body at the request of Sheriff Todd K. Baxter.

We recommend that Your Honorable Body adopt a Home Rule Message in regard to the above bill that will authorize Monroe County to offer an optional twenty year retirement plan to Sergeant Carl J. Zimmerman of the Monroe County Sheriff's Office Road Patrol.

Sergeant Carl J. Zimmerman began work in the Jail Bureau of the Monroe County Sheriff's Office on October 29, 1990. He transferred to the Road Patrol Division on May 25, 1998. His pension membership should have been transferred to the 20-year retirement plan authorized by §§552 and 553 of Article 14-B of the Retirement and Social Security Law. For reasons unrelated to any negligence on his part, the retirement plan transfer from the jail retirement plan to the authorized Road Patrol Division retirement plan did not occur. It was not until much later that he discovered that he was still in the Jail Bureau retirement plan. At that time, he was informed it was not possible to switch over to his correct retirement system without state legislative approval. To correct this error, this bill would authorize this Honorable Body to offer Sergeant Zimmerman the option to join this Road Patrol Division retirement plan with credit for past service.

The specific legislative action required is to adopt a Home Rule Message for Assembly Bill No. A.10626 Entitled "AN ACT to authorize the County of Monroe to offer an optional twenty year retirement plan to Carl J. Zimmerman, a sergeant employed by such county."

This is Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR §617.5(c)(26) ("routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment") and is not subject to further review under the State Environmental Revenue Act.

Adoption of this Home Rule Message will have no impact on the revenues or expenditures of the current Monroe County budget, however, if this bill becomes law, Your Honorable body will have the option of offering this pension benefit to Sergeant Zimmerman, which according to the fiscal note prepared by the Office of the State Comptroller would increase the County's annual contribution to the pension system by approximately \$11,000 for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2025. In future years, this cost will

vary as the billing rates and salary of Carl J. Zimmerman change. In addition to the annual contributions discussed above, there would be an immediate past service cost of approximately \$141,000, which will be borne by the County as a one-time payment on or before February 1, 2025 or at the County's election, it may amortize this cost over a five-year period, the cost or each year including interest would be \$31,500.

We recommend that this matter receive favorable action by Your Honorable Body.

Honorable Legislators:

This matter is being referred to Your Honorable Body at the request of Sheriff Todd K. Baxter.

We recommend that Your Honorable Body adopt a Home Rule Message in regard to the above bill that will authorize Monroe County to offer an optional twenty year retirement plan to Deputy Duane A. Palma of the Monroe County Sheriff's Office Road Patrol.

Deputy Palma is currently employed as a Road Patrol Deputy in the Monroe County Sheriff's office. He began his career in the Monroe County Jail bureau. He has over twenty years of law enforcement in multiple police agencies, including the Jail Bureau. Other members of his employment tier have successfully applied credit in the Jail Bureau plan towards the 20-year retirement plan. Deputy Palma anticipated that he would receive the same treatment. For reasons not ascribable to his own negligence, Deputy Palma was denied credit time for his service. This bill allows Deputy Palma the option of receiving full credit for the jail bureau service time in the 20-year retirement plan to rectify this error.

The specific legislative action required is to adopt a Home Rule Message for Assembly Bill No. A.10622 Entitled "AN ACT to authorize the granting of retirement service credit in the optional twenty year retirement plan to Duane A. Palma for service as a correction officer."

This is Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR §617.5(c)(26) ("routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment") and is not subject to further review under the State Environmental Revenue Act.

Adoption of this Home Rule Message will have no impact on the revenues or expenditures of the current Monroe County budget, however, according to the fiscal note prepared by the Office of the State Comptroller, this bill will not increase the County's future annual contribution to the pension system. There will be an immediate past service cost of approximately \$177,000, which would be borne by the County as a one-time payment. This estimate assumes that payment will be made on February 1, 2025. If the County elects to amortize this cost over a five-year period, the cost for each year including interest would be \$39,600.

We recommend that this matter receive favorable action by Your Honorable Body.

### Honorable Legislators:

This matter is being referred to Your Honorable Body at the request of Sheriff Todd K. Baxter.

We recommend that Your Honorable Body adopt a Home Rule Message in regard to the above bill that will authorize Monroe County to offer an optional twenty year retirement plan to Deputy Gregory M. Prokop of the Monroe County Sheriff's Office Road Patrol.

Deputy Prokop was hired to work in the Monroe County as a part-time road patrol deputy on October 7, 1991. In April 1996, Monroe County adopted the 20-year retirement plan provided in §§552 and 553 of Article 14-B of the Retirement and Social Security Law for Road Patrol division of the Sheriff's Office. In February 2000, Deputy Prokop became a fulltime deputy. The New York State Retirement System informed him he had one year from the adoption retirement plan in 1996 to become a member of the 20-year plan. He was not aware nor does he recall be informed of this requirement. He was also told that becoming a member of the 20-year plan now would require state legislative authorization. Assembly Bill A.10578 would permit this Honorable Body to approve such a transfer.

The specific legislative action required is to adopt a Home Rule Message for Assembly Bill No. A.10578 Entitled "AN ACT to authorize the County of Monroe to offer an optional twenty year retirement plan to Gregory M. Prokop, a deputy sheriff employed by such county."

### Honorable Legislators:

This matter is being referred to Your Honorable Body at the request of Sheriff Todd K. Baxter.

We recommend that Your Honorable Body adopt a Home Rule Message in regard to the above bill that will authorize Monroe County to offer an optional twenty year retirement plan to Captain Christopher R. Fay of the Monroe County Sheriff's Office Road Patrol.

Captain Fay was hired to work in the Monroe County Jail Bureau on August 26, 1991. On May 25, 1998, he was transferred to the Road Patrol Division. He pension membership should have been transferred to the 20-year retirement plan provided in §§552 and 553 of Article 14-B of the Retirement and Social Security Law. For reasons unknown to him, his pension plan membership was not transferred from the jail retirement plan to the 20-year Road Patrol plan.

When he learned that he was still in the jail retirement plan, he was informed that he could not be moved to the 20-year plan without state legislative approval. This bill would authorize this Honorable Body to approve such a transfer.

The specific legislative action required is to adopt a Home Rule Message for Assembly Bill No. A.10582 Entitled "AN ACT to authorize the County of Monroe to offer an optional twenty year retirement plan to Christopher R. Fay, a captain employed by such county."
