### RESOLUTION NO. 246 OF 2024

AMENDING 2024-2029 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM EXPANDING SCOPE AND INCREASING FUNDING FOR PROJECT ENTITLED "COUNTY OFFICE BUILDING RECONSTRUCTION;" AND AUTHORIZING CONTRACTS WITH STEVE GENERAL CONTRACTOR, INC., BELL MECHANICAL CONTRACTOR, INC., AND CONCORD ELECTRIC CORPORATION FOR CONSTRUCTION SERVICES FOR "COUNTY OFFICE BUILDING RECONSTRUCTION" PROJECT

- Section 3. The County Executive, or his designee, is hereby authorized to execute a contract with Bell Mechanical Contractor, Inc. in the amount of \$6,594,400 for mechanical construction services for the "County Office Building Reconstruction" project, and any amendments necessary to complete the project within the total capital fund(s) appropriation.
- Section 4. The County Executive, or his designee, is hereby authorized to execute a contract with Concord Electric Corporation in the amount of \$2,530,000 for electrical construction services for the "County Office Building Reconstruction" project, and any amendments necessary to complete the project within the total capital fund(s) appropriation.
- Section 5. Funding for this project, consistent with authorized uses, will be available in capital fund 1850 once the additional financing authorization requested is approved, and in any capital fund(s) created for the same intended purpose.
- Section 6. This resolution shall take effect in accordance with Section C2-7 of the Monroe County Charter.

### RESOLUTION NO. 247 OF 2024

### SUPERSEDING BOND RESOLUTION DATED OCTOBER 8, 2024

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$19,900,000 BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF MONROE, NEW YORK, TO FINANCE THE COST OF THE COUNTY OFFICE BUILDING RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT, IN AND FOR SAID COUNTY, AT AN ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST OF \$19,900,000 AND SUPERSEDING THE BOND RESOLUTION ADOPTED ON DECEMBER 14, 2021 (RESOLUTION NO. 488 OF 2021).

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF **NOT LESS THAN TWO-THIRDS OF THE TOTAL VOTING STRENGTH** OF THE LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF MONROE, as follows:

Section 1. For the object or purpose of financing the cost of the County Office Building Reconstruction Project, in and for the County of Monroe, New York (the "County"), there are hereby authorized to be issued \$19,900,000 bonds of the County, pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law. The duly adopted current Capital Budget of the County, to the extent inconsistent herewith, is hereby amended to provide for the appropriation of an additional \$9,900,000 to pay the cost of the aforesaid specific object or purpose (\$10,000,000 having been heretofore appropriated from one or more Capital Budgets). The period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is twenty-five (25) years, pursuant to subdivision 12(a)(1) of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, computed from June 30, 2021, the date of the first obligations issued therefor.

Section 2. The maximum estimated cost thereof is \$19,900,000, and the plan for the financing thereof is by the issuance of \$19,900,000 bonds of said County herein authorized, provided, however, that to the extent any state and/or federal aid and/or grant and/or gift is received for the aforesaid purpose, the County Executive, or his designee, is hereby authorized to accept and shall use such funds to redeem any outstanding indebtedness incurred for such purpose or apply it, dollar for dollar, to reduce the amount of bonds to be issued for such purpose.

Section 3. The faith and credit of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said County a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same become due and payable.

Section 4. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell the bonds and bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Director of Finance - Chief Financial Officer, the chief fiscal officer of the County under the Local Finance Law. The Director of Finance - Chief Financial Officer may sell such bonds or notes at public or private sale, at a discount or premium, at fixed or variable rates of interest or at no interest whatsoever, or as capital appreciation bonds, and with such amortization of principal as the Director of Finance - Chief Financial Officer shall determine is most favorable to the County, and in compliance with any rules of the State Comptroller applicable thereto. Such bonds or notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Director of Finance - Chief Financial Officer, consistent with the provisions of the Local

Finance Law. The Director of Finance - Chief Financial Officer may, in the event it is determined to issue variable rate bonds or notes, enter into such agreements as said officer finds reasonable to facilitate the issuance, sale, resale and repurchase of such bonds or notes, as authorized under Section 54.90 of the Local Finance Law. The Director of Finance - Chief Financial Officer is also authorized to enter into such agreements and take such other action as may be necessary or appropriate and lawful to assure that, to the extent possible, (i) interest on the bonds and notes authorized hereby will not be includable in the gross income, for federal income tax purposes, of the recipients thereof, and (ii) to enable the purchaser thereof to comply with Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12. The Director of Finance – Chief Financial Officer is hereby further delegated all powers of this County Legislature with respect to agreements for credit enhancement, derived from and pursuant to Section 168.00 of the Local Finance Law, for such bonds or notes, including, but not limited to the determination of the provider of such credit enhancement facility or facilities and the terms and contents of any agreement or agreements related thereto.

Section 5. All other matters, except as provided herein, relating to such bonds or notes, including prescribing whether manual or facsimile signatures shall appear on said bonds or notes, prescribing the method for the recording of ownership of said bonds or notes, appointing the fiscal agent or agents for said bonds or notes, providing for the printing and delivery of said bonds or notes (and if said bonds or notes are to be executed in the name of the County by only facsimile signatures, providing for the manual countersignature of a fiscal agent or of a designated official of the County), the date, form, denominations, maturities, interest rate or rates, terms of and manner of sale and interest payment dates, place or places of payment, and also including the consolidation with other issues, shall be determined by the Director of Finance - Chief Financial Officer. The Director of Finance - Chief Financial Officer may elect to become the fiscal agent for the bonds or notes, or may contract on behalf of the County for this service pursuant to the Local Finance Law. Such bonds or notes shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Director of Finance - Chief Financial Officer shall determine.

Section 6. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes, as authorized by this resolution, may be contested only if:

- such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said County is not authorized to expend money, or
- 2) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and
  - an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication, or
- 3) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 7. This resolution shall supersede Resolution No. 488 of 2021, being a bond resolution dated December 14, 2021, except to the extent that any indebtedness shall have been contracted or encumbrances made thereunder. The purpose of this superseding bond resolution is to effect the following: to increase the maximum estimated cost of the purpose to \$19,900,000, and to provide \$19,900,000 bonds therefor, an increase of \$9,900,000 over the \$10,000,000 bonds authorized under Resolution No. 488 of 2021.

Section 8. This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the objects or purposes described herein.

Section 9. This resolution shall take effect in accordance with Section C2-7 of the Monroe County Charter and the Clerk of the Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to publish this resolution or a summary hereof to be published, together with a notice attached in substantially the form and in the manner prescribed by Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Negative Declaration - Determination of no significant adverse environmental impact:

The Village of Brockport is proposing to install 2,370 linear feet of new concrete sidewalks on the south side of West Avenue between Carolin Drive and Briar Rose Lane. The Village will also install eight detectable warning plates at curb ramps and street crossings on this stretch of West Avenue. This project will extend the sidewalk system that currently ends at Carolin Drive further west improve the overall safety for those who walk on West Avenue.

The Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) EAF Mapper indicated that the project site is near a wetland. There is a federal wetland approximately 100 feet west of the intersection of Briar Rose Lane and West Avenue. The sidewalk is ending at Briar Rose Lane and will not impact the wetland.

The Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) EAF Mapper indicated that the project site is near a environmental remediation site. The RGE - Brockport MGP Site under the Voluntary Cleanup Program and is located approximately 1,700 feet southeast of the sidewalk project. Remedial actions have successfully achieved soil cleanup objectives for restricted-residential use. Residual contamination in the soil and groundwater is being managed under a Site Management Plan and Institutional controls.

The project does not impact the 100 year floodplain or any structures more than 50 years old. The project will not impact existing natural resources, historical or cultural resources and will not alter the existing community character or increase traffic. The proposed action is consistent with existing land use. Accordingly, the proposed action will have no significant effect upon the environment and is determined to be a negative determination.

The Town of Brighton 2024 Sidewalk Project involves installation of 6,300 +/- linear feet of ADA compliant, five-foot wide concrete sidewalk at four locations: 1. Elmwood Avenue (north side) between 2700 Elmwood Avenue and Highland Avenue (2,450 LF), 2. Westfall Road (north side) between Roosevelt Road and Monroe Avenue, Westfall Road (south side) between Del Rio and Edgewood Avenue (2,850 LF); 3. Edgewood Avenue (west side) between 17 Edgewood Avenue and Monroe Avenue (500 LF); 4. Aliens Creek Road (north side) between Monroe Avenue and Schoolhouse Lane (800 LF).

The Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) EAF Mapper indicated that the sidewalk projects are near various environmental remediation sites. The Town and Country Dry Cleaners site is listed as a State Superfund Site and located approximately 750 feet northwest of the Edgewood sidewalk project, 1,350 feet north of the Westfall Road sidewalk project and 2,300 feet northwest of the Allens Creek Road sidewalk project. The remediation site will not impact these sidewalk projects as remedial actions are complete and measures are in place to control the potential for coming in contact with contamination remaining at the site. The Carriage Cleaners is a State Superfund Site and is located approximately 1,000 feet south of the Elmwood Avenue sidewalk project. This site will not impact the sidewalk project as remedial actions have successfully achieved soil cleanup objectives for commercial use. Residual contamination in the soil, groundwater, and indoor air is being managed under a Site Management Plan.

Portions of the Edgewood Avenue, Elmwood Avenue and Westfall Road project are in a 100 year floodplain, however the impact will be negligible as the sidewalks will be constructed in an already developed area adjacent to existing roads. The Allens Creek Road sidewalk project is not within a floodplain. These sidewalk projects do not impact any structures more than 50 years old. The projects will not impact existing natural resources, historical or cultural resources and will not alter the existing community character or increase traffic. The proposed actions are consistent with existing land use. Accordingly, the proposed actions will have no significant effect upon the environment and is determined to be a negative determination.

## AUTHORIZING INTERMUNICIPAL AGREEMENT WITH CITY OF ROCHESTER FOR COLLECTION OF SOLID WASTE AND RECYCLING SERVICES FROM COUNTY FACILITIES

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF MONROE, as follows:

- Section 1. The County Executive, or his designee, is hereby authorized to execute an intermunicipal agreement, and any amendments thereto, with the City of Rochester to collect County-generated solid waste and recyclables, as well as provide street sweeping services from various County facilities for an estimated annual cost of \$650,000 from January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2027, with the option to renew for two (2) additional two-year terms.
