Raheim Robinson Sentenced to Life Without the Possibility of Parole

Rochester, NY- On June 13, 2024, 22-year-old Raheim Robinson was sentenced by Monroe County Court Judge Julie Hahn to Life in the New York State Department of Corrections Without the Possibility of Parole in addition to multiple sentences in the New York State Department of Corrections. He was previously convicted by a jury of all counts including, four counts of Murder in the 1st Degree, twelve counts of Criminal Possession of a Weapon in the 2nd Degree, Attempted Murder in the 2nd Degree, Reckless Endangerment in the 1st Degree, and Arson in the 4th Degree for violent acts committed on July 19 and July 20, 2022, which resulted in the deaths of Richard Collinge and MyJel Rand.

On the night of July 19, 2022 at approximately 9:00 PM, Rochester Police Officers were called to the intersection of North Clinton Avenue and Rauber Street for multiple gunshots in the area, including those that hit a house and vehicle.

On July 20, 2022, at approximately 12:30AM, Richard Collinge, MyJel Rand, and Tireek Burden were gunned down at that same corner. Following the gunshots, Rochester Police Officers arrived on scene, where Richard Collinge was pronounced dead. MyJel Rand and Tireek Burden were immediately transported to Strong Memorial Hospital, where MyJel died from his wounds.

Later in the early morning hours, a fire on Weyl Street in the City of Rochester was reported. A car was engulfed in flames, which began spreading to a nearby house. The Rochester Fire Department responded and put out the fire.

As the investigation continued, the evidence showed that 34-year-old Deadrick Fulwiley, 23-year-old Kelvin Vickers and Raheim Robinson were responsible for the murders of Richard Collinge, MyJel Rand, the attempted murder of Tireek Burden, as well as the arson of the vehicle that was used in the crimes. All three were charged with multiple crimes encompassing their conduct for that five hour period.

Deadrick Fulwiley pled guilty to two counts of Murder in the 2nd Degree and Criminal Possession of a Weapon in the 2nd Degree for the murders of Richard Collinge and MyJel Rand. He was sentenced to 30 years to Life in the New York State Department of Corrections.

Kelvin Vickers was also arrested for the murders of Richard Collinge and MyJel Rand. During the course of the investigation, Kelvin Vickers murdered Rochester Police Officer Anthony Mazurkiewicz and shot Rochester Police Officer Sino Seng. He was convicted for all three murders, and over a dozen other felony charges, and was sentenced to consecutive terms of Life Without the Possibility of Parole sentences.

The case was prosecuted by First Assistant District Attorney Perry Duckles.

“Today brings a final resolution to the murders of Richard Collinge and MyJel Rand,” said First Assistant District Attorney Perry Duckles. “Raheim Robinson, Deadrick Fulwiley, and Kelvin Vickers are all responsible for devastation and destruction to this community. Not one of these defendants considered the value of human life when they made the choice to murder Richard Collinge and MyJel Rand, which led to events involving the murder of Officer Mazurkiewicz at the hands of Kelvin Vickers. I am pleased that Raheim Robinson, Deadrick Fulwiley, and Kelvin Vickers are all serving life sentences in the New York State Department of Corrections. After so much heartache for the families of Richard Collinge and MyJel Rand, it is my hope that today’s sentence will finally bring a feeling of justice for their loved ones.”

“Raheim Robinson, Deadrick Fulwiley, and Kelvin Vickers terrorized the community, resulting in the murders of Richard Collinge and MyJel Rand, and subsequently the murder of Officer Mazurkiewicz,” said Monroe County District Attorney Sandra Doorley. “Involved in days of nonstop violence, these defendants terrorized the community with gun violence, arson, and murder. I want to thank the Rochester Police Department for putting as much work into finding justice for Richard Collinge and MyJel Rand, as they did for their fallen brother. As a danger to us all, Raheim Robinson deserves to spend the remainder of his days in custody, alongside his co-defendants. It is my hope that all three of these men consider Richard Collinge and MyJel Rand, whose young lives were stolen from their families.”
