Troy Jones Sentenced to 25 Years for the Death of Brandon McClary

Rochester, NY- Monday, June 17, 2024, New York State Supreme Court Justice Moran sentenced 24-year-old Troy Jones to 25 years in the New York State Department of Corrections plus 5 years of post-release supervision for his role in the homicide of Brandon McClary. Troy Jones previously pled guilty to Manslaughter in the 1st Degree.

On June 17, 2021, Rochester Police Officers responded to Genesee and Sawyer streets at approximately 7:00PM. Upon arrival, they located Brandon McClary, who had been shot multiple times. He was transported to Strong Memorial Hospital, but died from his injuries.

After a thorough investigation, the Rochester Police Department identified Troy Jones as the shooter and he was arrested days following the murder. The following month, Dayvon Dunbar was also arrested for his role in the shooting death of Brandon McClary. Dayvon Dunbar pled guilty to Manslaughter in the 1st Degree for his role in the homicide.

The case was prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney Robin Catalano, Chief of the Special Investigations Bureau and Senior Assistant District Attorney Jonathan Jirik, of the Vehicular Crimes Bureau.

"Exactly four years after his death, the family of Brandon McClary finally had the opportunity to see someone held accountable for this violent homicide," said Assistant District Attorney Robin Catalano. "Troy Jones chased down Brandon McClary and killed him in broad daylight on a busy city street. I want to thank the Rochester Police Department for their detailed investigation, resulting in today's sentence."

"Many lives were ruined from this senseless homicide," said District Attorney Sandra Doorley. "Troy Jones took this young man's life and will now spend the next two decades contemplating his choices that led him to this point. Even though they will never get their loved one back, it is our hope that the family of Brandon McClary feel a sense of justice in today's sentence."
