- Mendon Carol Cloen
  - Has been on the Conservation Board for one year and this is her first EMC meeting as
     Mendon rep

 Prioritizing getting town board to think more about environmental issues, they have been uncomfortable with conditioning permits and could be making more efforts towards conservation

#### Pittsford - Caroline Kilmer

- o 2.5 years on Pittsford Conservation Board
- Town created Climate Action Plan which was recently approved; interested in hearing about implementation of CAPs at town level
- Fleet electrification
- Member of the Water Education Collaborative (WEC), a local non-profit on water education

# • At Large - Deb Muratore

o 5 years on EMC

# • **Ogden** - Bill Parkhurst

- o 12/13 Years on the Ogden Conservation Board;
  - Regularly share Env issues and topic with the board
- o Town Comprehensive Plan recently reviewed
- Perc tests are being conducted in areas prone to ponding
- Ogden is an Erie Canal Village. There is a lot of farming, but a lot of development. New development and plans being reviewed for solar farms and cell tower – unsure if citizens grasp what's coming

## • **Penfield** - Cynette Cavaliere

- 1.5 years due to merger of Penfield Env. and Energy Boards but 10 years total prior on the EEOC
- o Priorities- updating town codes and developing sustainability procedures & preserving wooded and green spaces. Biggest struggle is the wooded E-Pods- no more tree inventory or requests for no tree removal. Removed due to implied overreach of policy on private property. They're updating energy code and there's also a public tree law now it's an ordinance that establishes tree management.

## • Honeoye Falls - Andy Less

- Chair for 20+ years. Board has taken a summer break (1<sup>st</sup> time) and is reconvening tonight. With EMC for 5 years
- Continuing with climate action plan with HFL students; added a lot of components, such as fuel data, over the summer. Not ready for bronze status yet.
- o Had been applying for grants for wastewater treatment plant
- Continuing to develop and revise their Parks Master Plan to update trails and parks footprint.
- o Trees
  - Updating Tree Master Plan
  - Working with Monroe Co. Soil and Water Conservation to plant trees
  - Continuing to apply for Tree City USA (must reapply yearly). Fourth year as designation
  - EPODS Adding a subdivision to the village, but are having difficulty maintaining

green space in center of subdivision. Found a work around. Used Forestry Master Plan and arborist to see if it fell into the Woodland EPOD code

o Interested in hearing about recycling and composting/Impact Earth, as well as vegetable and community gardens

## • Gates - Charles Johnson

- o 2 years on the Conservation Board
- Gates is a bronze level Climate Smart Community, but working towards silver
- o Farmers market was created
- o Added 23 more trees this year
- Want highway department but citizens largely oppose (15 acre proposed location)

# • Monroe County Legislator, Minority Caucus - Virginia McIntyre

- Also the Chair of the Gates Conservation Board
- Earth day celebration- brought in green companies to promote sustainability, Trying to put together an "Ecofest", a clean energy community event with composting demonstrations/workshops,
- Have been working with Finger Lakes Mgmt Council, Taylor heating and cooling, NYSERDA to provide information for community at next farmers market. Trying to maintain momentum and ensure community involvement.
- o Controversy over whether people want trees on their property. Very polarizing. Need to educate the value of trees.
- How to get people to bike more in Monroe county and promote Canal use; "Reconnect Rochester"
- o Going to promote buy green, buy local initiatives. Decreases emissions and supports local farmers

#### • Rush - Beth Hauk

- On Conservation Board for 2 years
- Looking at site plans (mostly single family homes), septic (most of Rush is on septic), and stormwater runoff
- o Challenge to get Town Board and Highway Dept. to listen to environmental input
- o Rush Recreation and Park Association now has a website
- New parcel along the Genesee
  - Worked with MC Soil and Water to plant 200 native trees; 150 more being added this fall
  - Large Grassland bird habitat working with Rochester birding groups
- o High involvement in development of tree committee
  - Trying to gain status as Tree City Tree City USA at arborday.org
- NYSERDA-Empower Incentives EmPower+ NYSERDA
  - Get rebates on decommissioning oil/upgrading heating/cooling.
  - Can have rep come and present (Crossfield Heating and Air Conditioning did all the legwork for Rush)
- o Work with Genesee Riverwatch
- Discussed Hundred Acre Nature Park

# • Perinton - Mark Gaul

4 years on Conservation Board, which is the 3<sup>rd</sup> longest serving member of 7 members

- Majority of time consumed with review of site plans and SEQR
- o Administering Town's easement program
  - Encouraging open space with tax breaks, as well as tax breaks for agriculture
  - Serve as environmental resource for Town Board, Planning, and Appeals boards
  - Successes:
    - Town enabled Erie canal overly district- stricter regulations for the area to preserve the canal (200ft on each side)
    - High Acres landfill Board is responsible to oversee operations. Had meeting in August.
    - Don't have capacity for CAP or Tree City status, but has a Sustainability Committee.

## • Monroe County Legislator, Majority Caucus – Sue Hughes-Smith

## • Hamlin - Steve Rutherford

- On Conservation Board for 11 years, Monroe County Fish Advisory for 10 years, and EMC for 8 years
- Lakeside Sewage open and operating
- No dredging in Sandy Creek yet near Brockport Yacht Club entrance; NYS wants to rip out and replace retaining walls and repair jetties by 2026
- o Reviewing and conducting site visits for land use developments
- Moratorium on solar panel/farm development until long term practicality is establishedlifespan of panels, elimination of e-waste from landowners
- Conservation board in charge of tree planting. Receive stipend of \$3,500 per year to spend on projects, including give out thousands of native species trees to the public on Labor Day. Using remainder of funds to plant trees around town
- New energy-smart Town Hall building was constructed

#### Henrietta - Bill Santos

- o 34 years on conservation board, has been on the EMC since the 90s.
- Updating Town's Landscape guidelines
- Town is renovating golf course and connecting trails within the town (E. River Rd trail, River Trail)
  - Lehigh valley trail new housing development being built with connections to trail.
- o Electric Collaborative when through citizens increase in green electricity opt-in
- Act as the EMC representative on the Monroe County Planning Board, a citizen and staff based committee which reviews the Capital Improvement Program (CIP)
- o Nominating and Community Liaison Chair

# • **Chili** – Larry Lazenby

- On Conservation board for 45 years
- Going through a lot of building reviews, as there are lots of new development in Chili
  - Ensuring appropriate landscaping is being put in.
  - New developments require 1 tree per household
  - In order to circumvent tree requirement for companies like Wegmans- 1% of development cost is to be donated to tree committee.

- Town implementing new Tree Policy and putting in new trees for Davis Park.
  - Have had difficulty getting summer help
  - Finding trees dying because they were weed whacked through the bark (not because of disease). Using expandable trunk guards to protect new trees.
  - Best practice for new caliper of trees is 1.5" for survival rate, not 2.5" caliper as previously thought. Implementation immediate for all new trees.
- Over last 6 months, lost 2 members on conservation board. Training new members has taken a lot of focus away from other issues
- Three high schools involved as part of EMC student pilot project Gates Chili, W.
   Irondequoit, and soon to be Churchville-Chili.

# • Rochester – Rosemary Jonientz

- o On Rochester Environmental Commission Board
- o Reviews SEQR and new zoning plans. Recently had public hearing for new city dvpt plan
- W. Irondequoit H.S. Colin Pieters and Finnegan Schleafer
  - o Has been on EMC for 4 months
  - Works with the school's Green Team and provides EMC information to the club. Also works on spreading the information to others.
- Gates-Chili H.S. Ethan Huynh
